## **Ardoch Kirk Session**

It has been an eventful period since the Autumn issue of The Link regarding the implementation of the Presbytery Mission Plan. Following the



instruction from Presbytery to move ahead with the Union with Blackford Church, a 'Basis of Union' was prepared and the congregations of Ardoch and Blackford both subsequently voted in favour of the Union. That was the easy bit - the real work starts now to create a United Church focussed on delivering a joint Mission Plan. The elders of both congregations are meeting in early December to continue discussions on the management structure for the newly united congregation. As part of the Basis of Union it has already been agreed that the elders of Ardoch and Blackford Churches will be the elders of the United congregation and that the financial assets and liabilities of the churches will be amalgamated. Action is underway to merge the bank accounts and members will be kept up to date on the need to alter the details of their Standing Orders or Direct Debits for their 'Givings' due to the change in name of the congregation to 'Ardoch and Blackford Parish Church'.

The Perth Presbytery Buildings Officer has indicated that the present Ardoch Manse does not meet the current Church of Scotland standards for manses: for example, the requirement to have an energy performance rating of 'C' or better. The Kirk Session has agreed that the existing manse should be sold, and a new one purchased. Work is on-going to facilitate the sale and purchase of suitable accommodation.

As part of the Kirk Session's duty of care for the congregation, it has been agreed that the wine served with the Elements should be alcohol free and that the bread should be gluten free.

Last year various groups within the congregation led worship in the Advent services leading up to Christmas. This arrangement is being followed again this year and members of your Kirk Session will lead the service on 'Peace'. There will be a Watchnight service at 11.30pm in Ardoch Church on 24th December and a Christmas Day Service at 10.00am.

The Kirk Session would like to thank all members of the various congregational groups for their dedication and hard work over the past year and wish all members of the congregation a peaceful and uplifting time at Christmas.

### **Blackford Kirk Session**

There has been a lot happening in our church since the previous Link report in August. On the 1st October our Kirk Session voted unanimously to agree on the draft Basis of Union with Ardoch. This draft Basis of Union was then voted on by members of our congregation on Sunday 20th October with 24 votes in favour and 3 votes against. The result of the vote from both congregations was taken to the Planning and Deployment Committee of Perth Presbytery who duly approved the Union under powers and this will take effect from 31st December 2024.

The next step in this process of the Union will see the formation of the new Kirk Session with elders of Ardoch and Blackford combining into one group. This new Kirk Session will be tasked with ensuring that all the required changes are managed as effectively as possible. Throughout this on-going process, we will endeavour to keep our congregation informed as to our progress so that everyone has the best understanding on what is happening. Please speak to any of our elders if you have any questions or queries.

The congregation and elders of Blackford Church will continue to focus on "The Five Marks of Mission" which encompasses everything we do to help us grow and spread the good news of the gospel across our parish and beyond.

In October internet connectivity was installed in the church with a contribution towards costs provided by the Blackford Community Fund. This will be a valuable asset for our church and our community organisations using the building. We are most grateful to the Blackford Community Fund for their support.

Over the past 3 months, we have welcomed four new members to our Church roll, namely Richard Bolton, Lyndsey Thomas, Eleanor Thomas, and Karen Shaw. We feel privileged for their support and commitment to our church and to God's work in our community.

At our November meeting of the Blackford Kirk Session, we were delighted to have the Rev. Dr. John Ferguson, our Presbytery Clerk with us and give an insight into the work of our Presbytery.



On closing, the Blackford elders' team would like to extend our grateful thanks to Mairi for all her work and support in caring for our church community. Please continue to pray for our minister, our church, and our service to all in our community. **Sandy Marshall** 

### From the writings of CS Lewis

"I remember once when I had been giving a talk to the R.A.F., an old, hard-bitten officer got up and said, 'I've no use for all that stuff. But, mind you, I'm a religious man too. I know there's a God. I've felt Him: out alone in the desert at night: the tremendous mystery. And that's just why I don't believe all your neat little dogmas and formulas about Him. To anyone who's met the real thing they all seem so petty and pedantic and unreal!'

Now in a sense I quite agreed with that man. I think he had probably had a real experience of God in the desert. And when he turned from that experience to the Christian creeds, I think he really was turning from something real to something less real.


In the same way, if a man has once looked at the Atlantic from the beach, and then goes and looks at a map of the Atlantic, he also will be turning from something real to something less real: turning from real waves to a bit of coloured paper. But here comes the point. The map is admittedly only coloured paper, but there are two things you have to remember about it.

In the first place, it is based on what hundreds and thousands of people have found out by sailing the real Atlantic. In that way it has behind it masses of experience just as real as the one you could have from the beach; only, while yours would be a single glimpse, the map fits all those different experiences together.

In the second place, if you want to go anywhere, the map is absolutely necessary. As long as you are content with walks on the beach, your own glimpses are far more fun than looking at a map. But the map is going to be more use than walks on the beach if you want to get to America."

## **Ardoch Manse**

The Church of Scotland has updated the Energy Performance Certificate requirements for Manses and they now all require to have an Energy Performance Certificate (EPC) which is in Bands A, B or C. The EPC for Ardoch Manse is in Band E. The Buildings Officer for the Presbytery was invited to visit and report on the suitability of our manse. His comments were that he could see no way in which the manse could



be brought up to the required standard and he recommended that we sell the manse and buy a more suitable house.

The Kirk Session of Ardoch have agreed to the sale and the purchase of a new manse and Perth Presbytery agree that this should go ahead as soon as possible. An Extract Minute of this decision was sent by the Presbytery to the General Trustees who have indicated that they agree to this decision.

A suitable house to replace the Manse is therefore being sought. The Church of Scotland will assist us with a Bridging Loan if required so that if a suitable house does become available it can be bought before selling the current Manse.

In the table opposite, we've offered a personal reading plan that uses Luke's Gospel rather than the usual Lectionary readings. It's a possible way to get into Luke's Gospel by doing a little bit each week right through to Easter—20th April. Shorter sections could be read several times each week

or longer chapters broken down over the week. Pause to pray asking God to speak before you read. Have a pen handy to mark what stands out, or use the Bible app on your phone or tablet to read from different translations. This pattern does not connect directly with our Sunday service teaching, but Luke's Gospel is a focus of the Lectionary year.



#### Responsibility

Taking responsibility is one of the most important factors that defines a person's real character. It is an indication of the type of person you truly are. Although failing to accept responsibility might work to your advantage on occasion, this poor choice will catch up with you eventually; it will typically cause more pain or loss for you down the road than if you'd stepped up to the situation and taken responsibility.



### Braco Warm Space and Social Club.

The Hub is fortunate to receive funding from Perth and Kinross Council for a further year. This has enabled the Warm Space and Social Club to continue to meet in Ardoch Church Hall from 11am to 3pm each Tuesday during the Winter (November – March inclusive). We are glad of the Session Clerks' enthusiasm for the project and all the help given by Charles Robertson to make this a success. We also thank the Kirk Session for their encouragement.

There are usually about 20 Hub attendees each week and they enjoy meeting up and chatting at 11am over a welcome cuppa and biscuits.

Lunch is served at 12 noon – a choice of two soups, a selection of sandwiches with refreshments and home baking to follow.

This session we have had visits at 1pm from Braco nursery (a 15 minute visit). We now have a small selection of suitable jigsaws on offer and it is wonderful to see the children enjoy the experience of being in a muti-generational environment. One Tuesday, the children created 10 digit cards for us to play Bingo. We also hosted the children for a 'story-time' where we showed a PowerPoint of pictures from 'Mog The Forgetful Cat' and we all had lots of fun shouting "Bother, bother that cat!" at the appropriate time as the story unfolded. The children are returning when Kirsty Duncan comes to entertain the group and she has promised to sing some Disney songs, etc. especially for the wee ones before she entertains The Hub group.

The format of the activities have fallen into a pattern and that continues: 1st Tuesday of the month – jigsaws and games; 2nd week - Bingo etc; 3rd week – Megaquiz and 4th- some sort of entertainment – often live. Where a 5th Tuesday occurs in a month – it's a surprise!



We are also trying to provide information about various areas of support available to anyone who may be struggling financially, or in need of confidential advice and/or help.

## **Makaton in Blackford**

You might have noticed that we have been gradually increasing the Makaton used in our Sunday services. I'm aiming to sign at least 2 hymns a week and we've added a prayer. It's usually a short prayer with simple language as lengthy prayers can be harder for people with communication difficulties to follow. You might also have noticed the symbol timeline across the top of each slide throughout the service. This is similar to a visual timetable – it is to help people know what is coming next in the service and how far through the service we are.

We are working on becoming "Makaton Aware" in the new year. We hope that all these things will help make our services more accessible. If there is something that would help you to be more comfortable in our services, or that would help you to understand or take part more easily, please let us know.

We've also started Sing and Sign sessions on the second Thursday of each month. So far we've learned the signs for "Any Dream Will Do", "What a Wonderful World", "Do-Re-Mi" and "Sky Full of Stars", We're looking forward to having fun with some Christmas songs when we meet on Thursday 12th December from 7:30-9:00pm in the Blackford Church Hall. We learn the signs at a slow pace, no previous
